## Exchange Club Hosts Students

The Exchange Club of Farmington played host to Leslye Michlin, Pat Cobb and Herman Bullinger, all Farmington High seniors, at their monthly luncheon recently.

Leslye, a Michigan Council of Churches exchange student to the Netherlands spoke briefly on the subject of "Summer experiences." She explained that she acquired a great understanding on a personal level, what she had learned about herself, on a national level, what she was able to understand about her country; and on a world level, how she learned to understand the differences in culture and language are only regional. She said it is by accepting the differences in culture and goals, and by placing emphasis on these rather than the differences, that we will gain world peace.

As Farmington High's American Field Service exchange student to Norway, Pat also spoke on the understandings she obtained in her experiences of the past summer. She said she was able to view herself, her country and her world in an objective manner.

Unimpaired by her environment and what she had always considered good and improved, she was able to redefine her values and reaffirm her appreciations.

Herman Bullinger, the American Field Service exchange student from Germany, spoke at length on what she had learned about people in the United States. She expressed appreciation to the other girls on the sameness of people throughout the world. She also told of some of the gross misconceptions that Europeans have about Americans and promised she would try to clarify these fallacies upon her return to her home near Nuremberg.

Herman also expressed her appreciation to members of the Exchange Club who sponsored her stay in Farmington.

The luncheon program concluded with the singing of "My Country 'Tis of Thee."

## Asks Review of Pit Ordinance

Township Board members discussed a request from James C. Lapham that the gravel pit ordinance, of the township be amended.

In a letter to the Township Supervisor, Trustee Wendell Brown stated that he had talked with Mr. Lapham regarding his gravel pit which is leased to the Munn Construction Co. Brown's letter states that Lapham complained, that under the present ordinance, the filling of the pit to the former grade level would be prohibited as it calls for 6" of earth on top of each layer of fill.

The matter has been referred to the attorney for study and recommendation.
