Formal installation of all officers of the congregation, the Women's League and Youth League, will take place during the worship service on Wednesday, Festival of the Holy Spirit, June 5.

The annual church picnic was announced for Sunday, June 12, at Island Lake State Recreation Area. A two-week daily vacation Bible school has been scheduled for July 18-28.
