Several generations of junior choir members have looked to Mrs. Wright for leadership, as a good friend and one who was very interested in them. Under her term as organist, Acolytes came into use in the Church and she developed the Acolyte program and has trained them. She has made this an experience of Christian education.

THE REV. ROBERT J. SEALS, Minister of the Church, said, "Mrs. Wright has always been a loyal worker and has given much of herself throughout this time under the leadership of four different pastors. She will remain in the hearts of Franklin singers for many years to come."

Mrs. Wright is not leaving the Community of the Church but will continue to serve in other capacities.
Mr. Herman Barth, Chairman of the music committee has announced that the committee has accepted the resignation with great regret and that a replacement will be sought through the summer months.

In addition to her volunteer work as an organist, Mrs. Wright was very instrumental in raising the levels of music in the Church, especially in connection with weddings. She will continue to teach her piano students. It is anticipated that the Church will honor her with a reception in the not too distant future.

Church Women Adopt Youngster

Members of the Women's Association of the First Presbyterian Church, Farmington, have financially adopted Park Sung Man, a young boy from Korea, through Foster Parents Plan. As foster parents to the boy the group is pledged to pay \$15 monthly towards the child's support.

The Women's Association has had another child under "Adoption" since 1958. She is Evangelia Valma, an 11-year-old Greek girl.

Park Sung Man is reportedly in the first grade of a primary school and is a good student.

His mother died when he was only three years old when she came down with one of the many diseases that plague the far Eastern country. After running a high fever for a time she died. His father continued to provide for the boy by peddling wood in an exact until 1957 when he died.

THE BOY had no relatives who could provide for him and thus he was taken to the local orphanage. He is helped in the orphanage by the monthly cash grant of his foster parents which reaches him under the supervision of Foster Parents Plan Inc.

The non-profit, government approved relief organization was founded in 1937 and is now helping more than 17,500 youngsters in Europe and Asia.

Of the \$15 monthly contribution, the child receives \$8, each month as an outright cash grant while the remainder is used for periodic food and new clothing packages as well as other services.
