Improved roads and adequate drainage will be the top action at the next meeting of the South Farmington Township Civic Association Inc. on June 30.

The meeting will be held at the Wheeler Street Fire Hall beginning at 8:00 p.m. Members will discuss the topics after which they will ballot giving their recommendation for future solution to the areas road and drainage problem.

The three alternative programs on which they will ballot are:

1. Special assessment districts to improve our roads.
2. The raising of one mill additional tax levy to improve our roads.
3. The present road program with any possible improvement.


