Warn Holiday Drivers To Be Careful This Weekend

The grim average of one traffic death every three hours and 18 minutes in the last seven days of the holiday observance in Michigan has brought a warning from the State Police to drive with extra care during the coming 78-hour week-end.

The State Police will again operate increased traffic safety patrols with the help of the National Guard, but in the final analysis, it is the responsibility of the motorist to drive so that he will not become involved in an accident or endanger himself or other drivers.

PASS DAYS for the State Police will be canceled and all available personnel used on road or patrol duty. Patrol shifts will be increased to 10 hours and non emergency intensive from noon Friday July 4 through midnight Monday July 5 will be focused on high accident areas with patrol coverage shifting as changing traffic patterns require.

State Police will be assisted by 104 Guard members as second men on two-man patrols of the point control. Another 96 members will aid sheriffs and one municipal police department.

The July Fourth period is the second worst holiday of the year for traffic deaths, according to the State Police statistics for the seven years of 1953-59. Christmas leads with one death every two hours and 37 minutes.

THE DEATH rate for the combined holiday periods of Memorial Day, July Fourth, Labor Day, Christmas and New Year's in the seven years is one every three hours and 32 minutes. With the exception of the holiday periods the average has been one every five hours and 17 minutes.
