## Farmington Dog Rates Among Best In Nation

Many experts on dog breeding and showing feel that the finest great dane in the country today is Rori of Noblebrook, who belongs to Rudy and Valerie Hilsen of 23500 Middlebrook, Rori, weighing about 180

pounds and standing 35 inches tall, recently won two top awards in Cleveland shows. In addition to the many citations he has received in Detroit-area shows.

In the heart of Ohio Special Show a month ago the Farmington dog walked off with top honors. Then again on June 26 in the city across Lake Erie, Rori was awarded the William J. Gregory Memorial Trophy as he again took first place in the competition.

NOW ONLY 25 months old, Rori is a seasoned veteran in "show business" having been entered in his first showing as a 3-month old pup. When he was but months old the Hilsens began entering him in competition against fully matured dogs. According to Mrs. Hilsen, Rori is a very gentle and kind dog. She points out, however, that it is a characteristic of great danes to select one particular member of the family as a favorite. In Rori's case, the favorite is Mr. Hilsen. Rori's brother, Mon-Ami, from the same litter, favors Mrs. Hilsen.

Mon-Ami is also a beautiful dog but lacks the maturity of his famous brother, Mrs. Hilsen said.

As evidenced by their size great danes like to eat, and they eat well. Other than food items, they consume 2 pounds of beef every day and are also given vitamins daily.

Even though the Hilsens have a three acre lot, only a small portion of the area is used for dogs. Strangely enough the danes don't require as much running room as most people would think.

THE HILSENS have always been fond of dogs and their special interest in great danes dates back about six years when they acquired their first one, a small pup. When born the great dane pups were very small weighing only 8 oz. to 1 lb. - 2 oz.

So far their grand champion Rori has sired three litters, the largest of which included 34 pups. Needless to say the Hilsens are hoping at least a few of these little ones will display some of the father's greatness.

Tentative plans now call for Rori's appearance in Westminster Show coming up in November at Madison Square Garden in New York. This is the biggest show of all and Rori will be meeting stiff competition from all over the nation.

Fellow dog breeders have urged the Hilsens to enter Rori as they are confident the big fellow will make a fine showing.

The first annual Oakland County All-Star football game will be played Friday night, August 19, at Warner Stadium in Pontiac.

PLAYERS will be selected from among the seniors on the 1959 All-Oakland County football team which was chosen by the ballot of 30 area coaches and 150 fans. Invitations to participate are being extended to various players by the Pontiac Junior Chamber of Commerce, sponsors of the game.

Harvey Chapman of Farmington has been designated as a probable selection for the south squad.

Players will be invited by coaches to report for training two weeks prior to the game.
