Bishop's Company to Present Two Plays at Trinity Episcopal Church

Bishop's Company players will make their third appearance at the Trinity Episcopal Church within a year when they arrive in Farmington to present "The Devil and Daniel Webster" Friday night and "Cry, The Beloved Country" on Saturday.

The highly enthusiastic reception of the group on its previous appearances here influenced the repeat engagement.

The Bishop's company is a unique group of actors and actresses who travel about the country putting on plays for church audiences using very little in the way of sets, costumes, makeup or stage props but rather relying on their own talents and the imagination of the audience.

Many of the actors are professionals, many of whom have been with

the Pasadena Playhouse in California and others have done world-wide tours.

EACH ACTOR receives a salary of only \$10 per week plus expenses. Their recompense is measured in larger dimensions, however, being their joy in being part of something in which they believe.

The company makes every effort to maintain a reverent atmosphere during a performance. The clergyman of the church is usually asked to preside so that the drama becomes a part of the evening of worship. The productions are designed for any type of architecture and generally the chance of the church is the setting.

The company, established 7 years ago, is composed of a total of 20 persons with home base in Santa Barbara, California. There are two travelling units, of six each and the other eight persons comprise the headquarters staff, who handle bookings and various other tasks. Members work on a rotating basis. After spending a certain amount of time travelling they are assigned to the headquarters for a period.

The travelling performance fee has been set at 150 end members of the host church are asked to provide the players with an evening meal, bed and breakfast.

The travelling groups average six hours a day on the road and the company has travelled more than 500,000 miles since its formation in 1953. The road units travel from town to town in station wagons and in trailers and have given as many as 15 performances a week. All members

Area Teachers Study in East

Two Farmington residents, Frank Glicker, 31585 Leclane Rd., and Charles F. Aneda, 31565 Leclane Rd., are studying at a six-week institute for High School Teachers in English being conducted at the Rutgers University Summer Session from July 6-August 12.

The institute is designed to help English teachers meet the problems created by increased class sizes in secondary schools. Supported by grants from the Ford Foundation, the program gives major attention to the "Rutgers Plan", developed by high school teachers who attended one of six institutes last summer.

The Rutgers Plan enables large school systems to limit English classes to 25 students through use of semi-professional, non-teaching assistants such as college-educated housewives. These assistants serve in supervisory capacities and do not handle the actual teaching responsibilities in classrooms.

MOST OF the teachers attending the institute are from Detroit and Chicago, cities which are experimenting with the Rutgers Plan in their school systems.

Glicker, a teacher at Central High School, Detroit, holds an M.S. degree from Wayne State University. A former employee of the Farmington Enterprise, he is now working for a master's degree.

Aneda teaches at Cooley High School in Detroit and has a B.S. from East Stroudsburg (Pa.) State Teachers College and an M.A. from Columbia University.
