Pat Kearney Hurls No-Hitter As Braves Continue Winning

Pat Kearney hurled a no-hitter last week as the Bartholomew Braves won their 20th straight game 2-0 over the Orioles. The Braves made it 10 straight Saturdays when they blasted the Yankees 12 to 0.
