

Plan to Mark Geese in Study

Conservation Department researchers have received federal approval to mark Canada geese for migration studies this fall. The geese have long puzzled observers watching flights at the Swan Creek Wildlife station. It is not known how long the birds remain after they arrive or whether they break into different flocks at this point.

The U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service has approved placing a few of the birds with new markers. 34,464 in County Obtain Social Sec. Benefits in '59

34,464 Oakland County residents were receiving social security benefits at the rate of \$23,554,740 a year at the end of 1959, as the Federal Social Security Administration reported. The program was started in 1935, according to William E. LaRoche, manager of the Pontiac district office of the Social Security Administration. "This is an increase of 9.5 percent in the number of beneficiaries since February 1959, the last previous month for which figures are available," he said. "This is an increase of 13.4 million persons were receiving old-age, survivors, and disability insurance monthly benefits at the end of 1959 at an annual rate of more than \$10 billion. At the close of 1940—the first year in which monthly benefits were payable—beneficiaries throughout the nation totaled 200,000. Almost half a million disabled worker beneficiaries and their dependents were receiving benefits at a yearly rate of over \$400 million in 1959." The number of wives, husbands, and children of disabled worker beneficiaries increased monthly benefits received sharply in 1959. Such
