The county propositions on last week's election billots were ones which directly affected each and every owner of property in this community.

The question of whether or not annual meetings should be permitted to continue or abolished for lack of interest in them was a really important one to be answered. Yet, despite the personal importance of this question, nearly 75 percent of the township's voters didn't exercise their right to express their polinion oit.
