Adventists Join in State Camp Meeting

Members of Farmington Seventh-day Adventist Church held worship services Saturday, August 8, at the 52nd annual camp meeting of the Michigan Adventists, Grand Lodge, along with more than 12,000 other church members from throughout Michigan.

The Grand Lodge campsite was a "tent city," which housed over 3,000 inhabitants for the duration of the church convocation. Thousands of others commuted by automobile to attend the services. This temporary city was well laid out with streets and avenues, and "house" numbers for the cabins, tents and trailers. Traffic police and watchmen were on 24 hour duty.

A modern cafeteria served food to the campers, while a well stocked grocery store was possible for those in attendance to prepare their own meals if they wished. A large display of Bibles and other Christian literature was available at the Book and Bible House on the camp grounds.

The main auditorium seated 10,000, while the building for youth and junior members accommodated 2,500. Smaller children attended meetings in large canvas pavilions, and were supervised on camp grounds during planned recreational periods.

Each Friday evening at sunset the Seventh-day Adventists ushered in their day of worship, which lasted until sunset Saturday. No work or commercial activity was carried on in the 24 hour convocation during that time, in accord with Biblical instructions on which Adventists base their worship beliefs.
