Army PFC Karl J. Thomas, son of Mr. and Mrs. Willard Thomas, 3220 Hathaway Livonia, Mich., is scheduled to participate with other personnel from the 101st Airborne Division in Exercise Bright Star at Fort Bragg, N.C., Aug. 15-28.

A massive airborne assault involving 30,000 troops is scheduled as one phase of the Strategic Army Corps (STAC) exercise. This single-day mass air drop will surpass in numbers any similar drop made during World War II or the Korean War.

Thomas is regularly assigned as a cannonier in Battery C of the 321st Artillery at Fort Campbell, Ky.

The 18-year-old soldier entered the Army in March 1959 and completed basic training at Fort Leonard Wood, Mo.

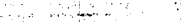

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Dies While Mowing Lawn

Charles M. Kirk of 25354 Ridged Drive suffered a fatal heart attack last week. He was found by his wife, Margaret Adele, lying in the back yard next to the lawn mower he had been cutting the grass with.

Kirk was rushed to Beaumont Hospital in Royal Oak by State Police from the Bedford Post Office where he was found dead on arrival.

Left to survive him besides his wife is a daughter, Mrs. Beverly Adele Jaton, of Grand Rapids and two grandsons.

Kirk, 59, was born in Albemarle, North Carolina. He moved to Detroit in 1929 and took employment with the Detroit News in 1931 where he worked until his death.

A stereotyping process expert, he had been stereotyping superintendent at the News since 1935. For several years he worked closely with the American Newspaper Publishers Association in developing standards for stereotyping processing which are now being used in the industry.

He was a founder and a past president of the Great Lakes Newspaper Mechanical Conference. Kirk was also a former president of the Detroit Local 1, International Stereotypers and Electrotypers Union.

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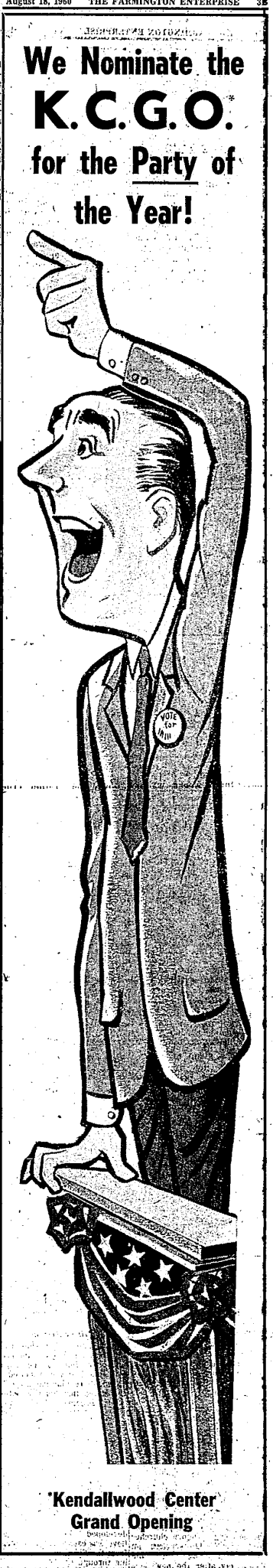

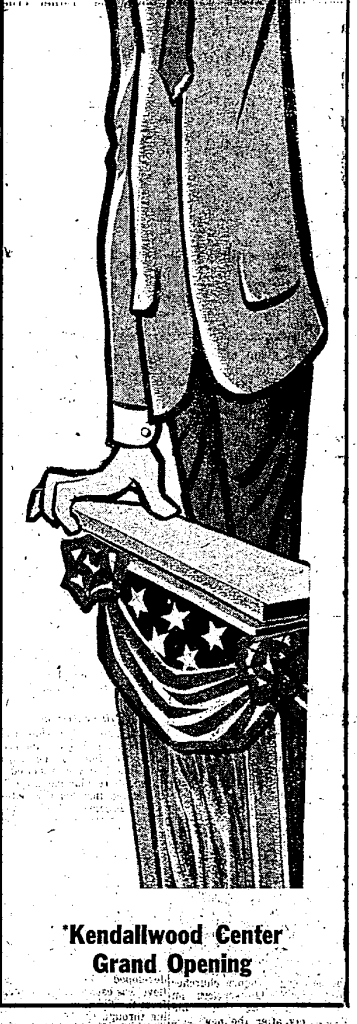
