Guyton Wins Fish Contest

Three Michigan anglers, including Lawrence Guyton of Farmington, qualified Aug. 6-7 for the Michigan State Fishing championship tournament to be held Sept. 24-25 at Houghton Lake. It was announced by Hy Peskin, executive director of the World Series of Sport Fishing.

A total of 38 more local contests are slated throughout the state this month, with winners in each contest advancing to the state finals. The state champion will compete in an all-expense paid world championship fishing tour through Michigan, Oct. 15-22.

The latest local contest was held to qualify for the Houghton Lake tournament with Guyton, who was Robert F. Ren, Bloomfield Hills, and Edward J. Putnam, Grosse Ile. All were winners of blue fishing tournaments during the Aug. 6-7 weekend. Competition at Houghton Lake was rained out during the same weekend.

Each contest is a one-day competition, open to all anglers with no entry fees and is won by the fishermen landing the highest weight of fish of the designated species. Weight stations are operated by the local angler and are open from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. on contest day.
