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Township of Farmington Board Proceedings

A regular meeting of the Township Board of the Township of Farmington, Oakland County, Michigan, was held at the Township Hall on August 10, 1960. Meeting was called to order at 8:00 o'clock P.M. by Mr. Curly Hall, Chairman.

Present: Mr. Curly Hall, Chairman; Avery, Brown, Bassette, Hug and Wilcox.

Minutes of previous meeting held July 20th, 1960, read by Clerk and stand approved as read.

Moved by Brown, Seconded by Hug.

WHEREAS, certain citizens of the Township of Farmington are constructing a sanitary sewerage system to serve the North One-Half of "Parcel F614," "B. G. Wesley's" Subdivision and Lots 1 to 18, both inclusive, of "Grand River Homes" Subdivision, all located in the Township of Farmington and

WHEREAS, it is deemed in the best interest of the citizens of the Township of Farmington that the County of Oakland should have authority to operate such system under Act 185 of the Public Acts of 1957, as amended;

AND WHEREAS, Section 9, Chapter 1 of said Act 185 requires that the County of Oakland, Department of Public Works, have the consent of the municipality wherein such system is rendered in order to serve in individual users;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Township Board of the Township of Farmington do hereby grant such consent to the County of Oakland, through its Department of Public Works, to operate a sanitary sewerage system to serve the North One-Half of "Parcel F614," "B. G. Wesley's" Subdivision and Lots 1 to 18, both inclusive, of "Grand River Homes" Subdivision and to serve individual users in said parcel and subdivisions;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Township of Farmington hereby waives all rights, titles or interests in said sewerage system.

MOTION by Brown, that letter from the Department of Public Works, County of Oakland, entered in the minutes of this Township Board meeting. Carried, unanimous.

Letter addressed to Mr. Curly Hall, Supervisor, Farmington Township, dated August 10, 1960, as follows:

"It has been brought to my attention that there is some concern as to whether the Kendallwood Arm of the Farmington Sewage Disposal System will go ahead and be constructed without an outlet to the City of Detroit.

"Please be advised that the on each installment due date. Any one or more installments may be paid without interest or before the due date of the first installment and thereafter any one or more installments may be paid in full at any time before due with interest accrued to the due date of the next installment. If any installment is not paid when due then the same shall be deemed to be delinquent and there shall be collected thereon, in addition to the interest above provided, a penalty at the rate of 1% for each month or fraction thereof that the same remains unpaid before being reported to the Township Board for reassessment upon the township tax roll.

3. That the Township Clerk is hereby directed to attach his warrant as required by law to said special assessment roll and to deliver said roll with warrant attached to the Township Treasurer. The said Township Treasurer shall thereupon collect the said special assessment in accordance with the terms of this resolution, the said warrant and the statutes of the State of Michigan, that on the first day of September following the date when any installment shall become due, the Township Treasurer shall submit to the Township Board a sworn statement setting forth the names of the persons delinquent, if known, a description of the parcels of land upon which there are delinquent installments and the amount of such delinquencies, including accrued interest and penalties computed to September 1 of each year. The Township Board shall certify such delinquencies to the Supervisor who shall re-assess on the annual township tax roll of each year in a column headed "Special Assessments" the sum so delinquent in interest and penalties to September 1 of each year and an additional penalty of 5% of the total amount. Thereafter the statutes relating to township taxes shall be applicable to such reassessments.

MOTION by Cairns, supported by Brown, that Clerk be directed to write Oakland County Department of Public Works instructing them to hold up any action on the Kendallwood Sewer Arm to point of application to Michigan Municipal Finance Commission for sale of bonds. Carried, unanimous.

MOTION by Cairns, supported by Brown, that the resolution as presented by Wilcox be referred to the Bonding Attorney for opinion and a letter be drafted by him to the M.F.C. asking for delay of sale of bonds for the Kendallwood Arm, Can.

RESOLUTION — That the Building Department will charge a unit rate for connection fee for interceptor tap to \$350 gallons of water, for one month \$25.00. For a piece of business for installing a Super-nalke, there will be a connection fee of from \$1400.00 to \$1800.00.

MOTION by Brown, supported by Avery, that the following resolution be adopted:

WHEREAS, the County of Oakland, through its Department of Public Works, has caused to be constructed the interceptor, and

WHEREAS, each of the municipalities within the above

interceptor service district who will use said sewerage disposal facilities have, through their duly elected legislative bodies, executed an agreement with the County of Oakland setting forth the conditions of service and payments therefor, and WHEREAS, said agreement requires that where master water meters or individual water meters are not used as basis of measurement for the determination of sewerage disposal service charge, said service charge shall be based upon the number of "units" served and

WHEREAS, said "unit" is defined as herein used to mean any property from which emanates that quantity of sanitary sewage ordinarily arising from the occupancy of a residence building by a single family of ordinary size, and

WHEREAS, said agreement further requires that the number of units to be assigned to any commercial, industrial or multiple residential purpose shall be determined by the Board, and

WHEREAS, a comprehensive study has been made of the water consumption from the known common uses of properties other than single family residential to determine equivalent unit assignments;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the total service unit assignment for any particular usage shall be a whole number and any fractional portion thereof shall be considered the next higher unit count; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the above unit factors shall apply throughout the Interceptor Service District, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any property owner who shall have the right to appeal to the Public Works Board any particular applied unit assignment, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the decision of the Board of Public Works shall be final.
