Cregar Among Top Riflemen
Three members of the Fifth U.S. Army Reserve Rifle Team competing in the 1960 National Matches at Camp Perry, Ohio have shot their way to three places in the Reserve Unclassified section of the Marine Corps Cup Match.
The highest place in this section taken by Fifth Army Reservists was fourth place which went to Corporal Thomas L. Miller of Fort Wayne, Indiana. Sixth place in that competition went to Second Lieutenant Richard E. Cregar of Farmington.
Private First Class Donald H. Mitchell Jr., Detroit, Michigan took 11th place.
Firing the service rifle in the big bore part of the Perry classic, these three citizen soldiers are among 3000 competitors entered in the contest.

Police Prepare For Labor Day Weekend Rush
Labor Day weekend, the third worst holiday period for traffic deaths in Michigan, will find the State Police, aided by the National Guard, again operating increased patrols.
Seventeen were killed in 15 fatal accidents over the weekend and a year ago. The average for the 72-hour period in the last seven years is one death every three hours and 40 minutes.
"I law enforcement officers will do it they can to prevent accidents in the heavy traffic of this last holiday weekend of the summer," Commissioner Joseph Chiles said, "but it's every motorist's responsibility to keep out of trouble by driving carefully and defensively."
STATE POLICE patrols will be lengthened to 10 hours and pass days canceled, with all available personnel being used on either desk or patrol duty from noon Friday, September 2, through midnight Monday, September 5.
Patrol emphasis will be on high accident and heavy traffic volume areas, shifting as changing conditions warrant.
There will be 1st National Guard members assisting the State Police on patrol or point control and another 96 will aid sheriff departments and one city police department.
