Ford Output Up Over Last Year

Ford Motor Company produced 102,261 passenger cars and trucks during August for a year-to-date total of 1,474,680 vehicles. The totals exceeded the 144,881 units made in August 1949, and last year's eight month output of 1,462,476.

'August production totaled 89,383 Ford, 6,689 Mercury, 29,303 Comet and 1,250 Lincoln passenger cars and 25,104 Ford trucks. The Ford car total included 46,422 Falcons and 10,419 Thunderbirds; Tractor output was 448.

Ford truck production for the eight-month period reached a postwar high of 246,939 topping the previous record of 245,104 units made in 1945.
