Cite Dangers In Arthritis 'Cure'

Physicians in Michigan have been urged to alert their patients to the dangers of misrepresented rugs and devices currently being promoted for the treatment and "cure" of arthritis.

Dr. James J. Lighthbody, medical director of the Michigan Chapter of The Arthritis and Rheumatism Foundation, said in the closing of physicians should only to inform their patients of the danger, but also to cooperate actively with Foundation efforts to protect arthritic sufferers from exploitation.

He cited a recent ARA report which documents the fact that arthritides in Michigan are being checked off sub-million annually by promoters of fraudulent remedies.

"Within recent years the number and variety of products advertised for relief of arthritis has increased to such an extent that their claims, can fetch any similar exploitations of the past," he said. Dr. Lighthbody claimed that "many of these products are 'obvious' 'hoax'."
