**Little League Gridders
Open Season Saturday**

Three weeks of practice have prepared the Farmington Little League squad for the first game of the season at Hazel Park this Saturday.

The coaches have been working hard to develop players to replace the many experienced boys lost from last year's starting lineup. Head coach Corky DeVriendt declined to comment on the outlook for success in the seven game schedule, other than to state that the opening game opponent, Hazel Park, would probably be the best team Farmington would face all season.

The squad is composed of two teams. Varsity and Freshmen. Coach DeVriendt is aided by Coaches Bill "Tiny" Rence, Joe DeVriendt, and Bill McDonald in handling the Varsity eleven. The boys on this team must not have attained their thirteenth birthday by August 1, and must weigh between 75 and 125 pounds. Among those returning from last year's outstanding aggregation, which

completed a record of eight wins against a single loss to the Cranford Rangers, are Joe Cranford, George Hahlich, Pat Lardy, Ron Martin, Carl Misch, John Telford and Tom Wall.

In addition, several boys have moved up from the Freshmen team, including John Sewell and Ernest McCarver. Newcomers who have caught the coaches' eye to date are Mark Foster, Fred Gustafson and Bill Hanson.

Assisting with the coaching of the Freshmen are Les Shires, John Sewell and Larry Stobbs. Their players are boys who are under eleven years of age or, being twelve years old, weigh less than 80 pounds. Back for another season are several holdovers from the 1959 team which won two games while dropping five contests and tying one. Included in this year's lineup are Paul Misch and Don Shires. Bill Bliss, Ron Brinlinger, Mike Brydlat, Terry Goyt, Jim McCarver, Perry Goyt and Terry Savage. Promising newcomers include Terry Chip, Dick Bayer, Chris Charles, Dave Zymorski, and Mark Stivers, who despite a weight of only 65 pounds, is one of the toughest players on the team.

The encounter with Hazel Park will start promptly at 1:00 p.m. when the Freshmen teams will meet. The Varsity game will follow at approximately 3:15 p.m. The Hazel Park field is located at Hazel Park High School, one block east of John R. and one block south of Nine Mile Road. The public is cordially invited.
