**Vista Villa Plat Returned by Bd**

Members of the Township Board unanimously passed a motion last Tuesday night meeting to return the Vista Villa preliminary plat to the Capitol Investment Company because of several insufficient items.

This course of action had been recommended by members of the planning Board at their meeting of September 2. Since then the developers had requested themselves that the plat be returned so that they could revise it and resubmit the return for consideration at a later date.

The Vista Villa proposed Development is located in section 28 of the Township.

Another motion was passed to present the recently submitted plans of Devonshire Oaks, Devonshire, in sections 2 and 3 or Hills No. 2 preliminary plat to the Planning Board for their consideration.

A SECONDARY purpose is to allow school officials to make recommendations on the route of proposed roadways in the planned subdivision thus eliminating developments having no interior routes to schools in the community.

Because of the size of the proposed Westlake development and due to the fact that another proposed development to the north called for 200 more homes, the School Board felt another elementary school site would be needed in this area to accommodate the influx of children.

During negotiations between the School Board and the developers on a 10 acre school site, disagreement on price and other matters by the two groups resulted in no agreement on the sale of land being reached.

Since the suit has been filed, the developer of the 200 home development to the north of the planned property has offered a 10% acre parcel to the School Board which would eliminate the need for the 10 acre site previously considered.

**Bel-Aire Greenbelt Report Due Oct. 3**

A report of the City Attorney, Robert Kelly will be given at the October 3 meeting regarding the Bel-Aire Greenbelt following his meeting with the attorney representing the property owners affected.

Kelly reported at Monday's meeting of the City Council that he had contacted with both owners and residential property owners in an effort to iron out differences but that he had had few replies.

move had been rumored for some time.

The letter acknowledged a degree of business that was unavoidable due to the nature of the business and further stated that weeds would be cut down so that it would not constitute a masonry wall as asked by some residents in the area.

FURTHER, THE LETTER denied that any ordinance was being violated and it concluded stating that much of the complaining was being done by the property owner adjacent to the trucking firm parent who was disappointed because the company would not purchase his property.

Residents at the meeting then stated that the noise continues much later than 10 p.m. and sometimes all through the night. They also cited the unsightly appearance of the Mother premises and that there were old tires, rubbish etc. scattered here and there with apparently no attempt being made to clean up the debris.

It was generally agreed that the noise problem did not exist during the day when the Mother trucks are away from the premises.

Will Install Traffic Light at OLR-13 Mile  
A traffic signal at 13 Mile and Orchard Lake Roads will be erected soon as members of the Township Board vote Tuesday night to approve the project.

**OK Exploration For Temporary School Sewer**

Hope it still being held out that it will be possible to get the 13 Mile Arroyo to the Farmington Interceptor Sewer constructed at least as far as the new North Farmington High school site but precautionary steps are being taken just in case.

At the request of the architect, the School Board took action Monday night authorizing exploratory work at the site to determine a suitable location for a temporary septic tank and drain line.

Some land owners in the area which would be served by the 13 Mile Arroyo have refused to sign a petition to get construction of the Arroyo started due to their opposition to the upgrading of residential zoning in the township.

Efforts are still being made to raise enough money from those land owners who are interested in getting buildings started to get the sewer arm in now. The plan is that these land owners would stand more than their proportionate share of the cost and that the money would be returned to them on a pay-back arrangement as others not paying for construction of the arm now, hooked in.

that Detroit was refusing to accept sewage from either of the two big interceptors. Original plans were to have the interceptors connected by the first part of July.

Negotiations during July and well into August between Detroit and Oakland County DPW officials proved fruitless. Court action started by five communities to get the Evergreen Interceptor connected and by Farmington and West Bloomfield to get the Farmington Interceptor hooked-up apparently stimulated the compromise move on the storm-drain project.

Connections of the two interceptors will eliminate the need for continuance of the court cases started by the communities to be served by these sewer lines.
