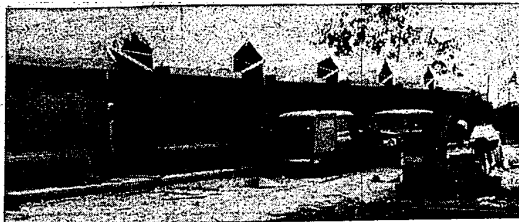

## Lay Cornerstone At New Lutheran Church

Cornerstone laying ceremonies at the Antioch Evangelical Lutheran Church, 13 Mile and Farmington Roads, took place Sunday with Pastor, Mrs. Anna Winkler of Centralia, Illinois and members of the building committee officiating.

Construction on the first unit building began May 8 of this year and completion has been scheduled for some time in November.

Articles of religious and historical significance to the congregation that were placed in the cornerstone were: a copy of the Christian scriptures, the revised standard version of the Bible, and a copy of the Lutheran Book of Concord.

Inscribed in Antioch's cornerstone are the words: "Christ Jesus the Chief Cornerstone" from Ephesians 2:20.

Until completion of the new church (the Antioch congregation will continue to worship in their temporary quarters at Dunkel Junior High School at 12 Mile Road).

Among the Bible passages to be read are these verses from Psalms (117:1): "The works of his hands are verily and judgment; all his commandments are sure. They stand fast for ever and ever, and are done in truth and uprightness."

Readings from "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures" by Mary Baker Eddy will include this (208:20): "Let us learn of the real and eternal, and prepare for the reign of Spirit, the kingdom of heaven, the reign and rule of God, the perfect harmony, which cannot be lost nor remain forever unseen."

The Golden Text is from Lamentations (3:19): "I bow down, I remain silent; I am as a shadow without form, I am driven from generation to generation."

Electro Lane, an experimental device that visibly or audibly warns motorists when he's too close to the pavement edge or centerline, will be put to practical use soon at General Motors Proving Grounds.

Somewhat comparable to the "beam" by which aircraft pilots keep course from one airport to another, Electro Lane was developed by Electronics and Instrumentation Department of GM Research Laboratories. Last Jan. 18, GM Research demonstrated it to the Highway Research Board, Washington, D.C.
