Motion by Bassette, supported by Wilcox, that the Township Board give final approval to rezoning SW Corner of Halsted and 13 Mile—2.75 AC. RC No. 1, title, said parcel to contain 650 ft. on 13 Mile Rd. and 687 ft. on Halsted Rd.

Motion by Jave, supported by Bassette, that the Township Board give final approval to Rezoning of W 150 ft. of Lot No. 2 of Oakland Hills Orchard Sub. from RA-2 to B-3.

Resolution by Avery, supported by Jave, that the Township of Farmington enter into a contract with the county of Oakland, Dept. of Public Works, relative to the construction of the Faraball Sewer Arm.

Resolution by Wilcox, supported by Jave, that the Township Board declares its intention to establish a sewer district for the purpose of constructing a sewer line through the Oakland Hills Orchard Subdivision and that Pate & Hirm and Bogue be instructed to submit tentative plans and cost estimates for the same.

Public Hearing on Water District No. 1. Called to order at 9:30 p.m. Two written objections from Mr. and Mrs. Frank Aurecki, Lot 1220, and Mr. Walter J. Wegzyn.

Public Hearing on Water District No. 1 closed at 9:55 p.m.

Motion by Jave, supported by Cairns, that a Public Hearing be held on October 15 at 8:00 p.m. for the purpose of hearing objections for necessity of a sewer arm, which will serve the Franklin Hills Golf Club, Fairgreen Hills Sub, Golf Lake Hills, and Coventry Sub; and that the Clerk be instructed to notify property owners of said Hearing.

Roll Call: 7 yeas, 0 nays. Motion carried.

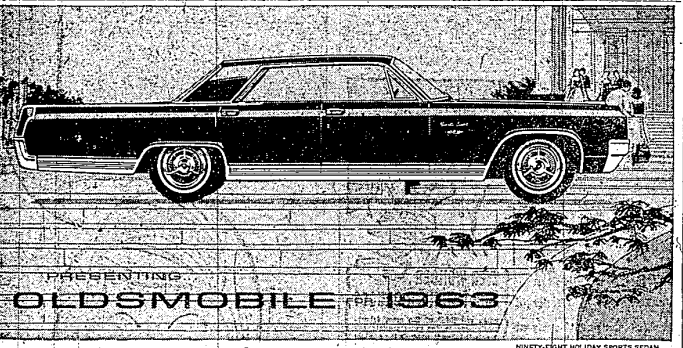

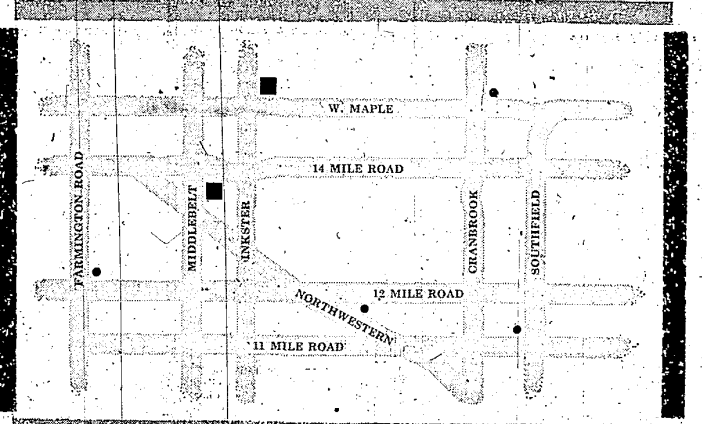
