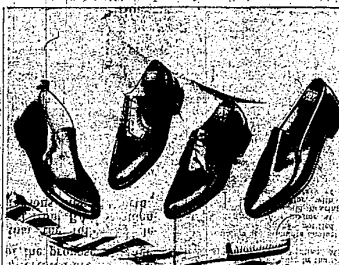

Sunday School begins at 9:45 and all children of the area are invited.

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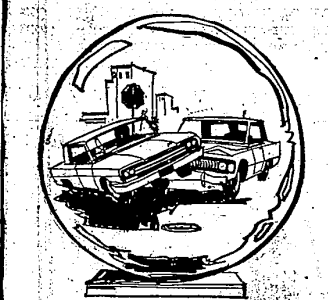

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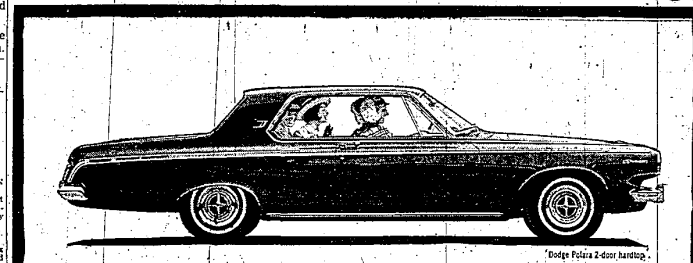
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
