City Council Proceedings

A Special meeting of the Council of the City of Farmington was held on October 28, 1962, for the purpose of adopting a Resolution providing for increase in planned total expenditure for capital improvement projects under the Accelerated Public Works Program.

Meeting called to order at 7:04 p.m. by Mayor Pro-Tem Brotherton.

ROLL CALL: Councilmen Brotherton, Forrest, Peterson and Thayer present. Lindbert absent.

CITY OFFICIALS PRESENT: City Manager Dinnan, Clerk Quinn.

Resolution Motion by Peterson, supported by Forrest, to adopt the following resolution:

Whereas, under the terms of Public Law 87-653, approved September 14, 1962, the United States of America has authorized the making of grants to aid in financing the construction of specific public works projects;

Now, Therefore, Be it Resolved by CITY OF FARMINGTON CITY COUNCIL:

1. That as of the date of filing of an application by a Municipal Corporation (hereinafter called an Applicant) with the Housing and Home Finance Agency, United States Government, for a grant to aid in financing the construction of municipal building including police and fire facilities court and municipal offices, the Applicant had capital improvements plan or capital improvement budget for the fiscal year or years during which construction of the proposed project is expected to occur; and that the total expenditure for capital improvements in said plan or budget was \$20,000 for the fiscal year ending 1962-63 and \$0 for the fiscal year ending 1963-64.

2. That in the event that said Federal grant is approved by the United States of America, said capital improvements plan or capital budget will be (5) hereby increased by \$42,500 for the fiscal year ending 1962-63 and \$20,000 for the fiscal year ending 1963-64 for a total increase of \$62,500 in the proposed or planned total expenditure for capital improvement projects (exclusive of Federal funds).

3. That said increase in the proposed or planned total expenditure for capital improvement projects shall be provided for by the City of Farmington.
