Farmington Historical Soc.  
Acquires Records and Relics

A reminiscence by a long-time resident, election of officers, the plaque indicating a new volunteer assignments to projects for the year, and the presentation of records, acquisitions come to the Farmington Historical Society at the first fall meeting of the Farmington Historical Society.

The meeting was held at Farmington Senior High Wednesday, October 24, 1962.

MRS. JEAN COX Zingerman, 55-year-long native of Farmington, except for a time in Ohio, spoke entertainingly of her days as a janitor at the old Noble School, of wintertime activities of students of those days, which included skating on the river, and spelling bees with neighboring schools.

She graduated from Farmington in 1922 in a class of two (338 in 1962). She still possesses her diploma and the program.

Regarding town geography, Mrs. Cox said that the time when the lake of Grand River from Warren Avenue to Redford was a plank road and the other side was "MUD". Users of the plank road had to pay two cents per mile if they were driving a team or one cent per mile for a horse and buggy.

Road and place names have changed too. Mrs. Cox stated, "What is now Farmington Road used to be North Farmington Road, Shiawassee Road used to be called Plank Road. How the name Clarenceville came into being Mrs. Cox would like to know. She was born in Ohio when the name was first used."

During the business meeting preceding the talk, the slate of officers presented by Mr. Harry Gibson was unanimously elected. Mrs. Charles Lorion will continue as president; Mr. Paul Schrieber will serve as vice-president; Mrs. John Coulter as secretary-treasurer; and Mr. Robert Briggs as corresponding secretary.

Various members have volunteered to undertake specific work assignments for the coming months.

MRS. HARLEY WALTERS will head the efforts of the Society in soliciting, compiling, and verifying all historical information surrounding the Town Hall.

Mrs. Philip Day and Mrs. Lorion will spearhead the Society's effort to increase the number of Centennial Farming designations in Farmington.

At present, only two farms have applied and received from

the State Historical Commission the plaque indicating a new family through sons or married daughters for at least 100 years and when the property owners make application to the state.

Mrs. Lorion has the application.

Vice-president Schrieber will investigate the possibility of a historical marker for Farmington. It is quite possible, according to Mrs. Lorion, that Farmington was the site of the first Quaker settlement in the state.


Navy Basic Training
