This must be completed and in the hands of the director before the audition. If the records are satisfactory, the student is called for an audition and interview.

The group chosen last year toured four countries: Ireland, England, Holland and Germany. They gave 100 concerts, 11 TV and radio programs to over 50,000 people.

The Choral is under the direction of Mr. Lester McCoy. Mr. McCoy is a graduate of Michigan State University, East Lansing, and is currently a student at the University of Michigan.

The three students, amid feelings of pride and expectation, had this to say about their coming adventure: "I'm overjoyed," exclaimed Sue Seely.

"I didn't think I'd really make it," Jim Brown said quickly.

"I'm proud to be able to sing in a group under the direction of a person like Mr. McCoy," Marcy Neal stated.

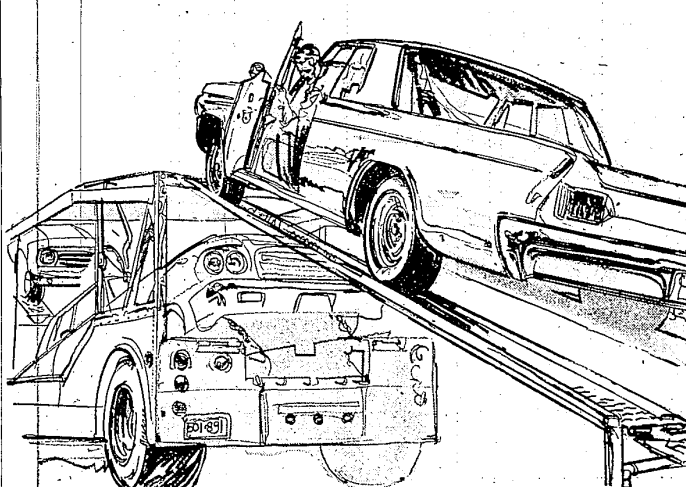
