Alice Polley Joins Students Taking Academic Challenge

Alice Lucille Polley, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. R. C. Polley of 2909 Grandview Drive in Farmington, is among nearly 5 percent of Miami University's undergraduates who are speeding up broadening their college work by participating in the Miami Honors Program.

Dr. James R. Woodworth, Honors Program director, said its program for the current semester has selected 382 Third students, are both volunteers and specially-invited participants since they generally have been invited to apply on the basis of past performance.

Of the total enrolled with Miss Polley 133 are freshmen, invited to participate because they ranked in the upper 10 percent of their high school graduating class and posted a composite percentile score of 91 or better on the ACT test.

THE MIAMI HONORS Program provides opportunity for students of high academic ability and seriousness of purpose to enroll in special courses and seminars devised to provide special challenge for them. Emphasis is placed on independent study, the development of critical thinking and the development of creative capabilities.

Miss Polley will be allowed considerable freedom in selecting advanced courses and in engaging in individual study projects for credit. She is per-

mitted to enroll in designated Honors courses and seminars.

No student may enter the Honors Program later than his sophomore year, except a transfer 89 freshman women.
