AMENDMENT TO SEWER CONNECTION CHARGE ORDINANCE

THE TOWNSHIP OF FARMINGTON ORDAINS:

A. That Paragraph 1, sub-paragraph (a), of Sewer Connection Charge Ordinance adopted May 26, 1959, and effective June 5, 1959, as amended, is amended to read as follows:

"(a) For each parcel of property occupied by a single residence building, the sum of \$350.00."

B. This amendatory ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its publication in the Farmington Enterprise, Farmington, Michigan.
