Council of Churches Presents Youth Drama and Panel Series

Edward B. Willingham, Jr., director of The Radio and T.V. Department of the Detroit Council of Churches announces the new T.V. program "Breakthrough" which was seen locally for the first time December 15 has been six years in the planning and production.

"Breakthrough" is a thirteen half-hour program. Part drama and part conversation, all the experience of most children. One is getting along with difficult people, another is concerned about one's actions, and still another shows the fear one often feels in a new and strange situation.

Every dramatic sketch opens every Breakthrough program. At a decision point, the story is interrupted with a studio discussion by boys and girls other than those in the case. These conversational interludes are moderated by the Reverend C. E. Atkins, pastor of the King's Church, Methodist Church in Springfield, Missouri.

The young actors and actresses who appear in the dramas were recruited from network television and the illuminating there. Among them is Betty Duke, who starred in the Broadway hit, "The Miracle Worker," and in the motion picture based upon the play.

The youngsters who participate in the discussions are non-professionals and represent many sections of the country. The new children's television series is a joint endeavor of the Methodist Board of Education, the Methodist Church, Radio and Film Commission (TRAFECO), and the United Church of Canada. It is being presented on television stations by councils of churches and similar cooperative church groups through the National Council of Churches.

Sermon to View Birth and Life Of The Master
The great significance of the birth and life of the Master, Christ Jesus, will be emphasized at Christian Science services Sunday.
Sermon readings will include the account in Matthew of wise men who followed a star to Bethlehem: "And when they were come into the house, they saw the young child with Mary his mother, and fell down, and worshipped him: and when they had opened their treasures, they presented unto him gifts: gold, and frankincense, and myrrh."
From "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures" by Mary Baker Eddy the following will be read (p. 215): "Jesus' spiritual origin and understanding enabled him to demonstrate the facts of being, — a process irreducibly human. Truth destroys material error, heals sickness, and overcomes death. The divine conception of Jesus manifested in truth and presented an illustration of creation."
The Lesson-Sermon is entitled "Is the Universe, Including Man, Evolved by Atomic Forces?"

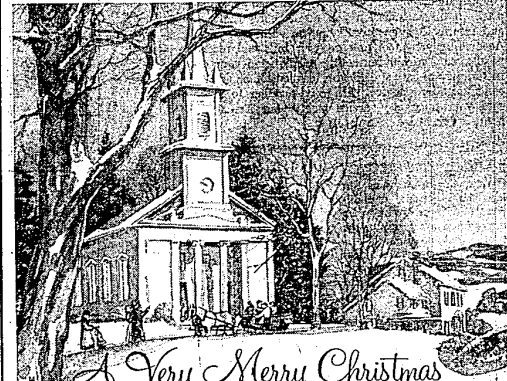
