The sincere sympathy of all their neighbors goes to Jim and Marie at this time.

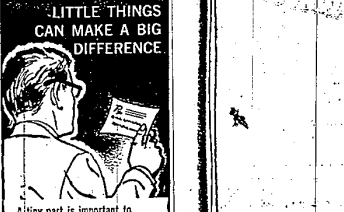

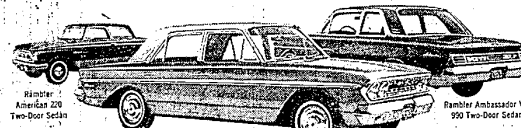
