scale set up for commercial establishments.

IT ALSO REMAINS to be seen if the Township Board will determine to make a similar uniform connection charge on dwelling units hooking up to future water systems in the Township.

The Township Board has decided a "dwelling unit" as any enclosure used as a home site, regardless of whether it be one of a group such as in apartment units or on wheels in the case of trailers. The Board expressed the view that the "initial benefit" for the service rendered by the system is the same to all users regardless of how much actual use each dwelling unit makes of the system.

The new amendment will go into effect next Thursday, February 7.

was abandoned because of lack of support.

Citing the North Farmington Teen Club, which recently dissolved, and a men's gym class in the O. E. Dunckel Junior High School with only struggling success, Opperhauser suggested that residents have had an opportunity in the past to rally in support of various recreational programs but have invariably exhibited general lack of enthusiasm. He also pointed out a possible duplication of effort on the part of the PARC with already existing programs being offered in Farmington.

EARL WHALEY, president of the Junior Chamber of Commerce, raised a doubt as to whether such apathy on the part of Township residents really existed, and stated that Jaycees were prepared to launch a campaign to inform, enlighten and educate residents as to the need and benefits of a PARC program.
