### WHAT YOU CHARACTERISTICS YOU SHOULD LOOK FOR

- SEMI-FAIR SKIN: Short, flat curls, always dressed to receive long, coarse guard hairs. Dry skin, red shades of brown.
- HAIR: Short, collar, flat curls. Has an "after" fur. Naturally gray or spotted; may be dyed different colors, brown, black and other colors.
- SWEETENED TEETH: Yellowish about fur, black or dark brown spots have black spots in the center.
- LEAPING: Short, flat, tower fur or reddish colored; marked with rosettes of brown, black rings.
- DRY: Short fit fur, tan with blue-gray background colors, narrow black or brown spots on elbows.
- SPOILED CAT: Spoiled spotted skins, similar to leopard, but smaller skin with sparse markings.
- SOFT SKIN: Soft, down fur, has whitish under. Deep, dense texture, with dark fur and ash-gray or brown long brown cast.
- DELICATE: Heavily furred, lightweight, with dense fur with soft, silky texture. Intense, guard hairs, dark rear rays skin are used naturally. Most spotted is dyed in different shades of brown.

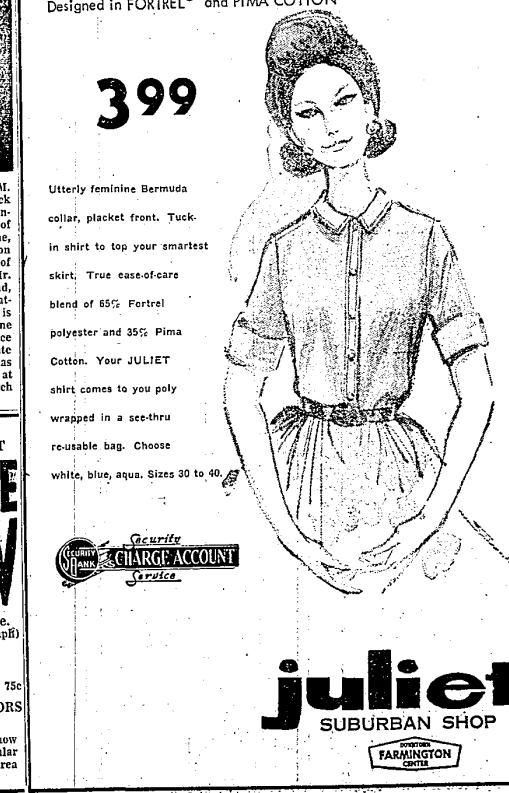
