Film to Depict World's Hunger

Many people in our country are unaware of the fact that hunger haunts most of the world's three billion people. The reality of this fact will be brought home by a 28 minute film, "The Hungry," which will be shown Tuesday evening at 7:30 at Middlebelt Elementary School.
