The system which kept Michigan's civil service independent are the bipartisan civil service commission members have long, overlapping terms and are appointed by the governor.

A new provision requires the commission to recommend rates of pay for all non-classified appointive positions in the executive branch.

Sputtering Before It's Off the Ground

As originally proposed, the Act was designed to require most stores to be closed one day out of every seven, either Saturday or Sunday.

Now Rep. Russell Strange of Clare has started a move to repeal the law as soon as it is scheduled to take effect.

It is really unfortunate that a Sunday Closing Act with some real teeth in it can not be made law in Michigan.
