Prominent Sculptor Appears at Wooddale

The Wooddale P.T.A. set aside funds for the purchase of a piece of sculpture for the school. Mrs. Beverly Ellis, the Art Consultant, was fortunate enough to acquire an excellent example of ceramic coil sculpture from the Raven Gallery. This red clay figure entitled "Woodoo" occupies a prominent place in the school lobby. Mrs. Tom Brun was invited to present a demonstration of his sculpture techniques at an assembly for the children in grades 2-8 on Friday, March 8, at Wooddale. MR. BRUN, in addition to his fine sculpture work, tends the Great Apes at the Detroit Zoological Park. Brun has been the caretaker of the Great Apes for the past 12 years. With his extensive background in the care of wild animals, Brun has a wide range of experience to draw from in describing many of their characteristics and features that must be considered by the sculptor attempting to fashion their likeness in clay or other modeling material. Brun incorporated in his talk to the children Wooddale and the Farmington District Schools art consultants present several of the important techniques he uses in sculpture. His talk was both entertaining and informative.

Pick Subject For Sun. Sermon

Recently Dr. Merker was cited by the Detroit Council Council for his many activities in the welfare, religious, educational, business and scientific organizations.
