William L. Hull To Speak Here

Walter C. Ballagh, Pastor of the First Baptist Church of Farmington, will introduce the Reverend William L. Hull to the church congregation at 10 a.m. and 7 p.m. services next Sunday, March 24.

Reverend Hull spent 27 years in Israel as a freewill, Christian missionary. He attended the trial of Adolf Eichmann as an unofficial observer; later he was appointed spiritual adviser to the detained man, and after hesitation was accepted by Eichmann.

IN A DEATH CELL at Israel's Ramleh Prison during 1952, an unusual drama unfolded. It was there that William L. Hull, accompanied by his wife who acted as interpreter, began an exhaustive debate with the Nazi war criminal Adolf Eichmann. Mr. Hull was the only minister allowed to enter Eichmann's cell. His purpose was to help the convicted man to the faith of his youth, and, if possible, learn the reasons for his monstrous acts against humanity and the Jewish people. As the spiritual duel progressed, an electric tension built up between the Nazi who claims he has prayed every day and knows God, but doesn't believe in Christ — and the minister who implores Eichmann to give up his philosophy of hate, and embrace, and accept Jesus Christ as his Saviour.

We feel that many members of the community who want to hear this first-hand account of the struggle for the soul of the Nazi war criminal, Adolf Eichmann, and extend a warm invitation to all interested persons to attend services at First Baptist Church of Farmington next Sunday.

Life of Christ Climactic Film Slated Sunday
"Crucifixion and Resurrection," the final picture in the full-color sound motion picture series of the Life of Christ will be shown Sunday night at 7 p.m. at the Southfield Community Church, 21122 Indian Road, between Beech and Inkster, north of Eight Mile, according to Pastor Raymond Bayne. Reverend Bayne, a member of the church, will narrate the cultural background of the times in connection with the film.

IN SPIRIT OF HIS wisdom and grace, the Life of Jesus terminated in a crucifixion but was resurrected by his resurrection. These dramatic facts are effectively portrayed in the film. Outstanding sequences include the remorseful Judas throwing the purse of silver coins at the feet of Caiaphas and how he hanged himself; the sealing of the tomb; his discovery empty; the upper room; and the convincing of Thomas. Everyone should see this breath-taking motion picture.

The song service will be conducted by Kurt Haney with his singing guitar.

In the morning service Don Douglas will preach. Mr. and Mrs. Don Douglas, young people raised and trained in the Southfield Community Church, will leave shortly for the Philippines as missionaries. This will be one of his final appearances before sailing.

HOPE FOR THE HANDICAPPED CHILDREN IMPROVES Pre-School Program Aids Our Handicapped Children

At the age of 3 years, Dale Brann, crippled, communicates with anyone. This lack of communication, stemming from a hearing problem, then created emotional disturbance. Dale was enrolled as a student at the Oakland County Society for Crippled Children as a student in the pre-school program. With very little speech which was unintelligible, a difficult behavior problem six months ago, he is now an active participant and responds eagerly with words and short sentences. For three months a week for 2 1/2 hours, a speech therapist, Lett Jones, a clinical psychologist works with these children. In addition, he receives play therapy and music and a good deal of socialization. Sitting around a small table, in a pleasant atmosphere much like an ordinary kindergarten classroom, he hears sound stimulation, auditory training, and practice in primary speech patterns.

Although Dale has responded very quickly, some of the other children show very little progress, even in their two years of attendance. The teacher emphasizes the importance of the individual's need, and the respect that each child must learn to learn to her and to the other children.

Missionary at Antioch Luth.

The Rev. Andrew B. Ellis, Lutheran Church in America staff missionary to Japan, will be the guest of Antioch Lutheran Church, Thirteen Mile and Farmington Roads, on Sunday, March 24. Pastor Ellis began his work in Japan in 1932 as the director of a mobile evangelism team utilizing a special Chapo-wheel unit constructed for him here in the Detroit area. The chapel unit resembles our mobile library trucks and contains its own power house, a complete religious library, audio-visual equipment, living quarters for three evangelists, and the necessary elements to set up an outdoor worship center. With this unit, Pastor Ellis traveled extensively, teaching, preaching, and training leaders in the Lutheran Church of Japan.

At present, Pastor Ellis is stationed in Kumamoto, City, Japan, and directs the evangelistic work in the country. You are cordially invited to hear this energetic young man at the Services of Worship at Antioch, March 24th, 11:00 and 11:00 a.m. An informal program and reception will be held at the church for Pastor Ellis and his family in the evening at 6:00 p.m. at which time, films of the work in Japan will be shown. This reception is being sponsored by the Lutheran League of Antioch.
