The youngest man to hold such office in Michigan history, Broomfield was elected to the Michigan Senate in 1954 and to the Eighty-fifth Congress in 1957 where he has successfully gained re-election since.

HIGHLY SOUGHT-AFTER as a banquet speaker, Congressman Broomfield, who holds a life membership in Optimist International, told the Farmington Chapter in his letter of acceptance that he was pleased to be featured speaker, "I accept with pleasure your generous offer."

Farmington Optimist Club, Charter President Fred Samra said the appearance of such a noted speaker at the April 27 Charter Presentation to be held in Botsford Inn, will assure a fine turnout by the public.

In addition to the acceptance of Broomfield, Samra reported that Mayor Robert Lindbergh of Farmington and Farmington Township Supervisor Curt Hall had both graciously accepted invitations to be present at the Charter Night Banquet.

Other City and Township officials, as well as area businessmen and school officials are being urged to attend the impressive Charter Presentation Banquet which will inaugurate the International Boys work service club in Farmington.

THE DANCE started at eight and with an orchestra of fine quality the DeMolays and dates could have "danced all night."

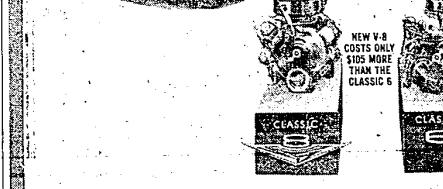
