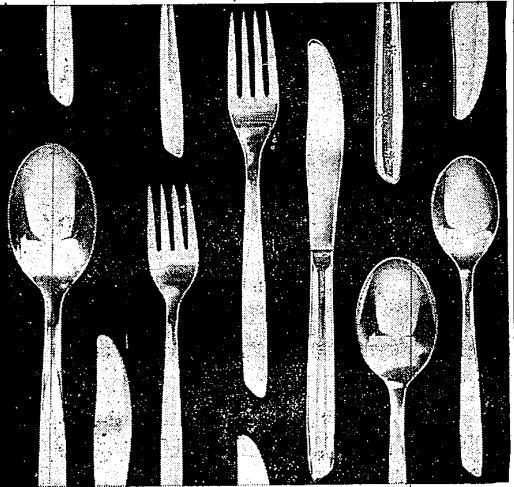


Meeting Held by Farm Bureau

Grade School Teachers Convene for Workshop

On Friday, April 26, the elementary instructional personnel of Farmington Public Schools spent the day at Beechview School seeing and using different techniques and tools for teaching. A unique welcome was extended by Mr. Gerald Harrison, Superintendent of Schools, when he spoke to the assembled group via a closed circuit television broadcast. IN THE KEYNOTE address Dr. Earl C. Kelley of Wayne State University emphasized that the main concern of the nation's schools should be human beings. All else should be relegated to a place of less importance, including subject matter. He pointed out, "A person can be well informed and not be a good human being." Dr. Kelley indicated that human beings, and in particular children, must thrive. In order to thrive a person must have love and acceptance, some freedom of choice, communication, a workable concept of self, an a chance to show their uniqueness. After the keynote address those assembled had an opportunity to meet in smaller groups with Mr. William Stapp, Conservation Consultant for Ann Arbor Public Schools, and Miss Margaret Scott, Audio-Visual Consultant for the Pontiac Public Schools. The importance of field trips was stressed by Mr. Stapp, including the preparation and follow-up. Miss Scott demonstrated the utilization of the many audio visual techniques and their application in the classroom. THE ELEMENTARY instructional staff also had an opportunity to view many exhibits of tools and techniques for teaching. Among these were two lessons broadcast over the closed circuit television hook-up.
