Farmington YMCA Plans Summer Camp Program

Hospital Visit by Therapists For Family Care Program

Thirteen family care therapists recently visited the Plymouth State Home and Training School in a meeting designed to review hospital policies and procedures as related to the Family Care Program. Members of the institution's staff, under the direction of LeRoy Watts, Director of Social Work, planned the session. Dr. Robert I. Jaslow, Medical Superintendent, addressed the group and expressed appreciation for the work they are doing. "THE FAMILY CARE Program," Dr. Jaslow explained, "involves placing selected children in private homes where they may receive the more individualized attention available only in a family situation. The family care therapists are paid at a definite rate and the institution assumes full responsibility for all medical care."
Started less than a year ago, 21 children have been placed in homes in the community. Dr. Jaslow explained that it is planned to place an additional five to ten children but lack of funds will prevent any further expansion beyond this at the present time.
