

### Scholarships Awarded to 17 Farmington High Seniors

Two Farmington Senior High School seniors have won Regents Alumni Scholarships to the University of Michigan.

Stated to receive the awards are Peter Fuoco of 2946 Lochmoor and Naomi A. 1947 of 2815 Bridgeman. Frances H. Thornton of 2900 Hayden in Farmington, a senior at Our Lady of Sorrows High School, also has won a Regents-Alumni Scholarship.

Seniors in 416 state high schools will receive 73 Regents-Alumni Scholarships to the University of Michigan, according to Ivan W. Parker, assistant director financial aids.

About 2,000 applied for the awards which are awarded annually.

Last year 619 seniors in 376 accredited Michigan high schools won awards.

**THE STIPENDS VARY** according to the financial need of winners, ranging from an honorary \$50 entrance award to a \$500 per-year grant. In a number of very deserving cases, the scholarship contract included an offer of part-time employment and long term loans in the amount of \$1,000.

This package approach is being tried for the first time this year. Awards continue for the normal length of each student's degree program if his academic record justifies renewal.

Each accredited school is entitled to at least one of the scholarships if a qualified senior applies. Also, some awards are granted at-large on the basis of state-wide comparison of applicants from participating schools. There are no limits on the number of applicants from awards to any one school.

In evaluating the applicants, emphasis is on character, citizenship, academic record, financial need, and scores of a composite test.

UOI alumni and Alumnae Club members who worked on the project gave invaluable assistance to high school officials and the University scholarship committee, Parker said.

**Needs Studied By Librarians**

Librarians from Oakland County public schools made plans yesterday (Wednesday, May 1) to take a searching-look at the assets and needs of their libraries.

The Council brings the Scouting program to approximately 180 boys from ages 8 to 18 of 75 communities in a 1,000 square mile area comprising most of Oakland and Macomb counties.

The organization has four districts: Macomb, Manito, Ottawa and Pontiac.

In an after-dinner session, Miss Mildred Nickel, director of Lansing Public Schools Libraries, discussed goals for school libraries and how to achieve them. Miss Nickel, was formerly school library consultant for the State of Illinois.
