

### Phony ID Card Peddler Arrested by FBI Agents

Special Agent in Charge of the Detroit Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, Bernard C. Brown, today announced the arrest of Gary Lewis Kasco, 3733 Lincoln, Birmingham.

Kasco, as the principal person, is being charged with the printing, reproduction, distribution and selling of phony Selective Service cards and numerous other types of identification. Kasco is alleged to have sold this phony identification to more than 50 people, most of whom are teenagers residing in the Birmingham area.

Investigation by FBI Agents disclosed that the teenagers, including girls, most of whom are high school students, were purchasing this phony identification and using it to attend night-clubs and buy alcoholic beverages which would otherwise be denied to them.

**DURING THE COURSE** Brown received instruction in the operation of Army aircraft, and in the servicing and maintenance of airplanes and helicopters.

The 19-year-old soldier entered the Army in February 1963 and completed basic combat training at Fort Knox, Ky.
