County College Issue Still Live

The Oakland County Community College is still a live issue. Meeting last week, the Oakland Schools Board of Education unanimously approved a resolution to place the community college question on the ballot in June 1954.

In addition, the county school group requested the Citizens Advisory Committee on the community college to reconvene in the fall to assist in the campaign for the two-year institution.

Dr. William J. Emerson, superintendent of Oakland Schools, told the board he had received "all kinds of encouraging letters" since the June 10 vote. The community college idea was accepted in the June 10 election by a 2,000 majority, but a small majority rejected a one-mill tax levy for support of the institution. According to state law, if one of the proposals fails, both fail.

Board member Monroe M. Osmond, of Pontiac, said an early election was an early indication of the intentions of the Oakland Schools board.

Some supporters of the plan, however, were Dave Allen, community college in local school districts greater opportunity to work toward a successful election next June.
