West African Missionaries To Speak Here

The Reverend Bernard L. Bresson will exchange his position as professor at Evangel College, Springfield, Mo., for that of principal at Evangel High School, Umuahia, Nigeria. He and Mrs. Bresson have recently been approved for missionary appointment to West Africa. In a service—July 12, 7:30 pm at the Farmington Assemblies of God church, 29420 Grand River, they will tell about their future work.

Evangel High School where both the Bressons will be teaching, was started in 1962 by the Roland Division of the Nigerian Assemblies of God. Enrollment now 120, is expected to reach 340 by 1965.

THE REV. BRESSON has been a pastor, and Mrs. Bresson served two terms as a missionary in Nigeria. Both are experienced educators.

As a minister, the Reverend Bresson pioneered Assemblies of God churches in Bellevue and Ferndale, Michigan, and pastored the Assembly in Pontiac, Mich. As an educator he taught high school in Los Angeles, California, and has served since 1955 (with the exception of one year) as history professor at Evangel College, liberal Arts school of the Assemblies of God.

The Reverend Bresson attended Parsons Business College and West Michigan University, both in Kalamazoo, Michigan. He has earned B.A. and M.A. degrees from Wayne State University, Detroit, Michigan, and has completed classwork for a PhD at the University of Southern California.
