ORDINANCE NO. 31 FIRE PROTECTION - WATER SUPPLY

By the power granted to the Township Board of the Township of Farmington, Michigan, by the Act of 1951, both as amended, and by the Act of 1951, both as amended, the Township of Farmington Ordains:

Section 1. This Ordinance shall apply to any subdivision or other area being served by any public or private water supply system which system services fire hydrants which are available to the Farmington Township fire department for fire protection purposes.

Section 2. Whenever, in the judgment of the Farmington Township Board, the water for fire protection services of the fire hydrants in any subdivision or area as defined in Section 1 thereof is endangered because of low pressures, low water tables, or any other reason at the Farmington Township Board may by resolution prohibit the use of any water from such systems for the sprinkling of lawns, watering of automobiles, or any other purpose other than the usual domestic purposes of a residence.

Section 3. Such resolution may be passed at any regular or special meeting of the Township Board and shall remain in effect for the period of time set forth in said resolution, such period not to exceed 30 days. If, at the expiration of the time set forth in the resolution such danger shall not have ceased the Township Board may by resolution extend such period from time to time but not to exceed 30 days for each such extension.

Section 4. All persons residing in any subdivision or area as defined in Section 1 shall be notified of the passage of such a resolution by letter to be addressed to the addresses to which water billings are sent, or as may be otherwise provided by the Township Board.

Section 5. Violation of any resolution which may be passed by the Farmington Township Board hereunder shall be a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punishable by a fine not to exceed \$100.00 or imprisonment in the Oakland County Jail not to exceed 90 days or both such fine and imprisonment at the discretion of the Court.

Section 6. This Ordinance shall become effective 30 days after its publication in the Farmington Enterprise, Farmington, Michigan.

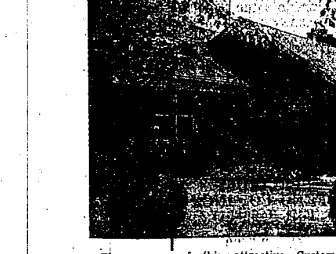
