ORDINANCE NO. 31 FIRE PROTECTION... By the power granted to the Township Board of the Township of Farmington by the provisions of Act 246 of the Public Acts of 1951, but not to exceed 30 days for each such extension.

Section 1. This Ordinance shall apply to any subdivision for which a permit for fire protection purposes...

Section 2. Whenever, in the judgment of the Farmington Township Board, the use of fire protection services of the fire hydrants in any subdivision or area as defined in Section 1 hereof is endangered because of low pressures, low water tables, or any other reason affecting the supply or pressure of water in said fire hydrants...

Section 3. Such resolution may be passed at any regular or special meeting of the Township Board and shall remain in effect for the period of time set forth in said resolution, such period not to exceed 30 days.

ORDINANCE NO. 32 ANTI-BLIGHT ORDINANCE An Ordinance to prevent, reduce or eliminate blighting factors or causes of blight within Farmington Township, Oakland County, Michigan, to provide for the enforcement hereof; and to provide penalties for the violation hereof.

By the authority granted to the Township by Act 244 of the Public Acts of 1954, as amended, it is the purpose of this ordinance to provide for the prevention or elimination of blighting factors which exist or which may in the future exist in said Township.

Section 2. Cause of Blight or Blighting Factor. It is hereby determined that the following uses, structures, conditions or activities, which, if allowed to exist, will tend to result in blighting or blighting factors in any of the following neighborhoods, or after the effective date of this ordinance no person, firm or corporation, shall maintain or permit to be maintained any of these causes of blight or blighting factors upon any property in Farmington Township owned, leased, occupied by such person, firm or corporation.

A. In any area zoned for residential purposes, the storage upon any property of building materials, lumber, brick, concrete or other materials intended for use in connection with such construction. Building materials shall include, but not be limited to lumber, bricks, concrete or other materials, plumbing, electrical wiring or equipment, heating ducts or equipment, shingles, mortar, cement, sand, gravel, shingles, or any other materials used in constructing any structure.

C. In any area zoned for residential purposes, the storage of accumulation of trash, rubbish or refuse of any kind except domestic refuse stored in such a manner as to create a nuisance for a period not to exceed thirty days. The term "junk" shall include parts of machinery or motor vehicles, unused stoves or other appliances stored in the open, tents, awnings, metal or any other material of any kind whether or not the same could be put to any reasonable use.

D. In any area the existence of any structure or part of any structure which because of fire, wind or other natural disaster, or because of deterioration is no longer habitable, if it is dwelling, nor useful for any other purpose for which it may have been intended.

E. In any area zoned for residential purposes, the existence of any structure or part of any structure which is not fully or neatly boarded up and otherwise well protected to prevent entry of vandals.

F. In any area the existence of any partially completed structure or building, or any other construction in accordance with a valid and subsisting building permit issued by the Township and unless such construction is completed within a reasonable time.

Section 3. Enforcement and Penalties. This ordinance shall be enforced by such persons who shall be so designated by the Township Board.

B. The owner, if possible and the occupant of any property which is the cause of blight or blighting factors set forth in Section 2 hereof is hereby notified that he is notified in writing to remove or eliminate such causes of blight or blighting factors within ten days after service of the notice upon such. Such notice may be served personally, or by registered mail, return receipt requested.

Additional time may be granted for the enforcement of this ordinance where bona fide efforts to remove or eliminate such causes of blight or blighting factors are in progress.

C. Failure to comply with the notice within the time allowed by the owner and/or occupant shall constitute a violation of this ordinance.

D. Violation of this ordinance shall be a misdemeanor which shall be punishable by a fine not to exceed \$100.00 or imprisonment in the Oakland County Jail for a period of not more than 30 days or both such fine and imprisonment at the discretion of the Court.

This Ordinance shall become effective 30 days after its publication in the Farmington Enterprise, Farmington, Michigan.
