## To Open First Section of I-96 In Twp. July 29

More than five miles of the new 1-96 / Expressway which traverses Farmington Township between 11- and 12 Mile roads will be opened Monday, July 29, it was revealed this week by the Township Supervisor's of-fice.

The 5.4-mile section is part of the Defroit East-West Metro-polltan Freeway land stretches from just west of Haggerty Road to Orchard Lake Road. Later this year, an additional 2.5 miles from Orchard Lake Road to Northwestern Highway will be opened to traffic.

# Will Try New Cafeteria Satellite Program In Some Schools This Year

A plan to provide for more efficient and economical operal one of the hot lunch program in some of the schools in the Farmington public school system will be just into effect on a trial basis for the 1963-64 school year. The plan is referred to as cafeteria statellite operations.

Mrs. Ella Plichta, cafeteria director for the entire school system, presented an outline of the proposed program to the Board of Education at its regular meeting Monday night.
