The Communication Arts Institute, now in its fifth year, is an outgrowth of separate high school journalism and speech institutes which began 16 years ago.

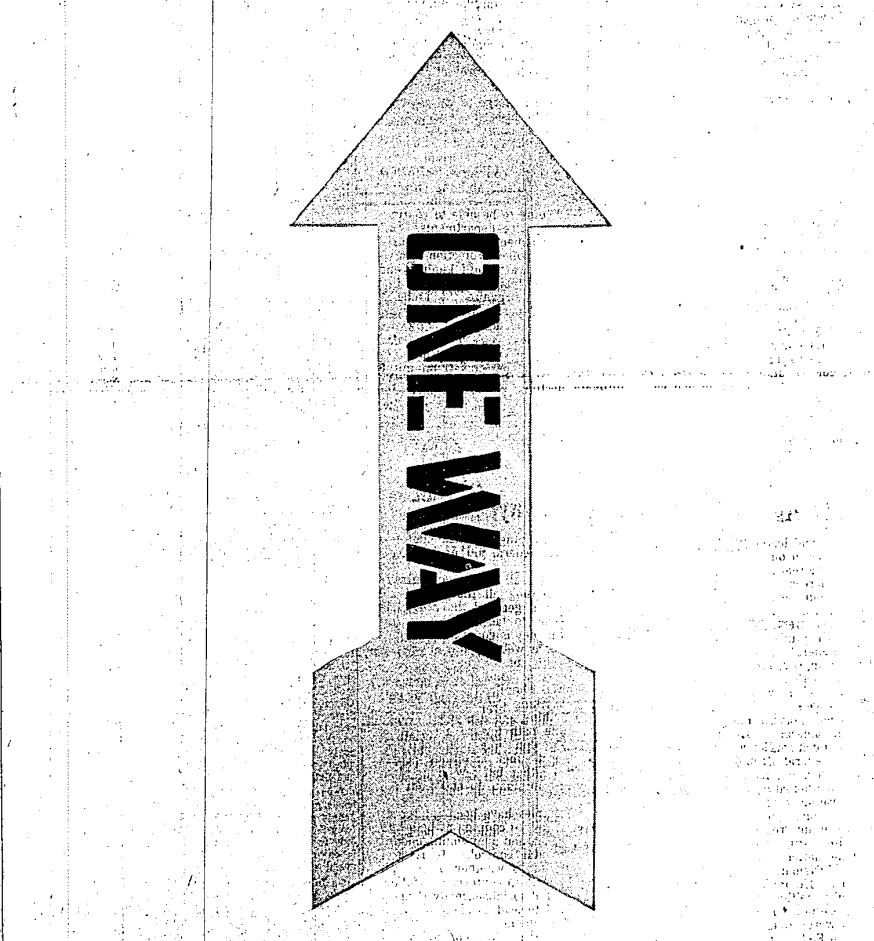
Area Clarinet Player in Band At 1963 Michigan State Fair
