Natl Program For Chemistry Teacher Here
The names of 79 secondary school mathematics and science teachers who have been selected to attend the Seventh Annual National Science Foundation Mathematics and Science Institute at Clarkson College of Technology from July 1 to August 23 were recently announced by Dean F. Gordon Lindsay, director of Clarkson's Summer Program.
Among the teachers selected is Donald J. North, 2036 Park St., Livonia, a chemistry teacher at Howell Farmington High School.
The training carries a stipend from the National Science Foundation which has set up these institutes throughout the nation "to improve the subject matter competence of those teachers, to strengthen their capacity to motivate students to consider careers in science; and to bring the teachers into personal contact with highly productive scientists." The course work may be applied toward credits for a master of science degree.
