

### Retires After 21 Years With GM's Diesel Div.

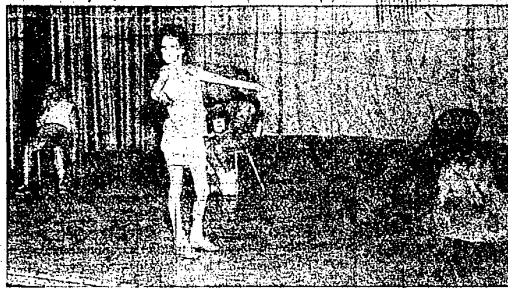

### Issues Health Warning Alert

"Wild skunks should not be picked up and handled," warns Dr. John D. Monroe, Oakland County Health Director.

"Contrary to what you might think by reading recent stories, skunks can be extremely dangerous. Many wild animals, particularly skunks, carry rabies which is a very serious disease."

DR. MONROE also points out that anyone bitten by an animal may have to undergo the Pasteur Treatment—a series of painful shots. The only way to avoid the shots, once you are bitten, is to determine that the animal is not rabid.

For this reason any animal which has bitten a person should not be killed. If possible, the animal should be apprehended and confined under observation of a veterinarian for at least fourteen days. Ordinarily the animal will die in five days, if it has rabies. In cases where the animal dies from rabies, the Pasteur Treatment must be given to the bitten person.

So far this year only one case of animal rabies has been reported in Oakland County. But 31 cases of rabies in animals have been reported in Michigan. And 18 of these cases have been in skunks.

RABIES IS A disease that can affect humans, dogs and other warm-blooded animals. It is caused by a virus that attacks the central nervous system, and it is invariably fatal once symptoms appear.

Rabies is usually transmitted to humans by animals' bites, particularly from dogs and wild animals. Efforts to prevent rabies have been aimed at the vaccination of dogs. It is now compulsory in Oakland County to have dogs vaccinated prior to licensing.

"In view of the rabies situation, skunks and other wild animals should not be picked up for pets," advises Dr. Monroe. "There is always the chance that the animals may have rabies and any bites you receive could become very serious."
