REGISTRATION OF BICYCLES ORDNANCE No. 17 By the authority vested in the Township Board by Act 245 of the Public Acts of 1945, as amended, THE TOWNSHIP OF FARMINGTON ORDNANCE: 1. Any resident of the Township of Farmington may register any bicycle owned by such person and located within the Township in the following manner:

2. Application for bicycle registration shall be made to the Township Police Department upon forms to be furnished by the Township. 3. A fee of \$1.00 shall accompany applications for bicycle registration. Such fees shall be deposited in the general fund of the Township. 4. A registration plate shall be issued to the applicant by the Police Department. Such registration plate shall be securely attached to the frame of the bicycle in such a position as to be clearly visible.

5. The Police Department shall keep a record of the number of each registration plate, the date issued, the name and address of the licensee, the name or make of the bicycle, and the serial number stamped thereon. 6. No person shall remove a registration plate from a bicycle except in the event that the bicycle is dismantled and no longer operated, in the event that the ownership of said bicycle is transferred to a person who is not residing within the Township of Farmington, or unless the registration is cancelled. 7.
