\$39.50. The asphalt work which the city will stand the cost on will run \$10,474.50 and the curb and gutter work which the state will pay for, \$3,185.

City Manager John Dinan told councilmen and interested business people that he saw no reason why the entire project could not be completed before the end of September.

While all were in accord with going ahead on the step removal and installation of new walks, Councilman Henry Forrest objected strongly to the expenditure of \$6,000 by the city to purchase the right-of-way.

It was his feeling that beneficiaries should stand the cost. He also voiced concern with the need for this access route to the business buildings which might be experienced.

TWO CITIZENS from Alta Loma Subdivision where Forrest resides also voiced objection to the expenditure of city taxpayers' money in this manner as did W. Allen Nelson of Warner Avenue.

During discussion it was brought out to Forrest that a survey made earlier had shown that a large number of motorists would use the route to get to and from the parking lot to business establishments on Grand River.

It was also emphasized that business on the south side of Grand River had agreed earlier to pay a special assessment to help finance the parking lot with the understanding that this access route would be kept open by the city.
